Upcoming Opportunities for Training to Develop Virtual Exchange Projects

May - June 2018

Erasmus+ Virtual Exchange is a ground-breaking project enabling youth in Europe and the Southern Mediterranean to engage in meaningful intercultural experiences online, as part of their formal or non-formal education.

Transnational Erasmus+ Virtual Exchange Projects (TEPs) are curriculum-based <u>Virtual Exchanges</u> jointly developed by two or more educators and/or youth workers located in different countries with the training and support of UNICollaboration. TEPs can be developed around the development of skills (e.g. photography, citizen journalism, foreign languages), contemporary issues (e.g. the environment, activism, migration) or subject-specific curricula (e.g. artificial intelligence, child development, immigration law) to view the course content from different perspectives adding an international and intercultural dimension.

TEPs are designed to engage young people in sustained interaction with peers across the Mediterranean and to foster the development of participants' language and communication skills, digital literacies, team-working and problem-solving skills in addition to enriching their understanding of course content.

Applicants have to submit an application form. If you do not have a partner but would like support in finding a partner university please indicate this in the application form.

Who is this for?

Professors who have already implemented Virtual Exchange (VE) and wish to adapt their project to be a Transnational Erasmus+ Virtual Exchange Project (TEP) during the autumn semester 2018.

Requirements

Applicants have to have already carried out a VE (also called telecollaboration, COIL, etc.) together and must submit a joint proposal.

How is the training delivered?

On a Moodle platform and with synchronous video conferences

How long does it last and what is the time commitment?

2-3 hours a week for 4 weeks

What topics are covered?

- What is Erasmus+ Virtual Exchange
- Principles of Online Intercultural Discussion and Integration into VE Projects
- Open Badges: Principles, concepts, criteria for TEP badges, issuing and endorsing
- GDPR Privacy Implications for VE Educators and Researchers

- Technical support for Facilitated Synchronous Discussions
- Moodle Platform for TEP (if desired)
- Recognition of VE project with Open Badges awarded to professors upon completion of training and successful implementation and to students up completion of TEP.
